LOS ANGELES LEAGUE OF CONSERVATION VOTERS ENDORSES DANNY TABOR FOR INGLEWOOD MAYOR

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – The Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters, the county-wide political action organization dedicated to supporting candidates and ballot measures that protect the environment, today announced its endorsement Danny Tabor for Inglewood Mayor.

“We are pleased to endorse Danny Tabor. Danny has demonstrated a strong commitment to urban renewal through his opposition to LAX expansion without extensive and appropriate community investments in health and environmental programs, among other important actions,” said LALCV President Andi Liebenbaum. “LALCV looks forward to more engagement in environmental programs, practices and policies in the City of Inglewood through the leadership of Danny Tabor.”

“My 12 years of elective office in Inglewood as a City Councilmember combined with my 35 years of professional and volunteer social and environmental activism clearly distinguish me from the incumbent whose pro-development agenda harms our environment and has huge impacts on the quality of our lives and that of our families,” said Tabor.

“Danny Tabor has worked hard in this City, listening to community residents and empowering community leaders.
