Todd Campbell Endorsed for Burbank City Council Race

BURBANK, Calif. – Burbank City Council candidate Todd Campbell has been endorsed by the Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters (LALCV). LALCV President Andi Liebenbaum cited Campbell's history of environmental leadership and his goals for addressing Burbank's traffic and air quality challenges in announcing the group's endorsement.

"As Policy Director for the Coalition for Clean Air, Todd has clearly demonstrated his ability to work with businesses, community groups and regulators in putting together policies and programs that address serious air quality problems, including those faced by Burbank residents," said Liebenbaum. She cited tighter diesel emission standards, the phase-out of toxic dry cleaning chemicals and enforcement of existing environmental regulations as being among those air quality improvements where Campbell played a major role.

Campbell, who is a third-generation Burbank resident, says he will aim to address traffic congestion concerns that are challenging Burbank's friendly small-town atmosphere as well as contributing to environmental concerns. He also opposes expansion of the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport, preferring to see other airports in the region share the growth in air traffic. Campbell is a former member of the LALCV Board of Directors.

"It's especially gratifying to see a former Board member seeking public office," said Liebenbaum. "Todd's commitment to the environment is certainly
