## **LA League of Conservation Voters endorses Scott Houston & Bill Fisher for El Segundo City Council**

L.A. COUNTY – The Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters (LALCV) – which has supported pro-environment candidates in Los Angeles County for more than three decades – today announced its endorsement of Scott Houston and Bill Fisher for El Segundo City Council in the upcoming April 13<sup>th</sup> election.

“Councilmember Bill Fisher has been a leader in El Segundo’s sustainability effort, including his work on the city’s Green Team, recycling improvements, alternative energy programs, green building standards and stormwater retention projects,” said Anthony Rendon, LALCV President. “Scott Houston has worked with community groups and the El Segundo Capital Improvement Program Advisory Committee, and has shown an impressive commitment to conservation and key quality-of-life issues for El Segundo.”
