LA League of Conservation Voters endorses Tonia Reyes Uranga for Long Beach City Council

L.A. COUNTY – The Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters (LALCV) – which has supported pro-environment candidates in Los Angeles County for more than three decades – today announced its endorsement of Tonia Reyes Uranga for the Long Beach City Council District 7 seat in the upcoming June 8th election.

“Tonia Reyes Uranga has been a leader on vital environmental issues affecting people’s health and quality of life in Long Beach,” said LALCV President Anthony Rendon. “In particular, she clearly understands the everyday human and economic costs of port-related pollution, and has fought for a cleaner, safer port for Long Beach residents.”

As a Councilmember, Reyes Uranga worked with community and environmental organizations such as the Coalition for Clean and Safe Ports to implement policies that address air quality at the Port of Long Beach. She was also supportive of a Sustainable City Commission and pushed for the appointment of a district representative as well as the ability to make recommendations for appointees to the Mayor. Reyes Uranga was named the Chair of the City Council’s newly formed Environmental Committee and coordinated the work of this committee with the Sustainable Cities Commission.
