LA League of Conservation Voters endorses Laura Rosenthal and Mike Sidley for Malibu City Council

L.A. COUNTY – The Los Angeles League of Conservation Voters (LALCV) – which has supported pro-environment candidates in Los Angeles County for more than three decades – today announced its endorsement of Laura Rosenthal and Mike Sidley for the Malibu City Council in the upcoming April 13th election.

“LALCV believes that Mike Sidley and Laura Rosenthal have the background and dedication to bring people together to make the tough decisions necessary to finally address key environmental priorities like ending Malibu’s longstanding water pollution problem,” said LALCV President Anthony Rendon. “Sidley has a demonstrated commitment to environmental protection and to ensuring Malibu’s vitality as a city - and he’ll focus on solving Malibu’s water quality problem. A Public Works Commissioner, Rosenthal has worked for clean water, conservation and recycling solutions, and has promoted energy efficiency and green building practices for new building projects. She supports the Malibu General Plan and promises to protect Malibu’s fragile environment.”

Malibu, like so many communities in Los Angeles County, faces significant environmental challenges. In particular, Malibu Lagoon and Surfrider Beach have long been plagued by major wastewater and stormwater pollution - and the human health and environmental problems it causes - but the city has failed to adequately address them. Mike Sidley and Laura Rosenthal represent new leadership for the City of Malibu, and they will make cleaning up Malibu’s water the priority it needs to be.
